Michael Likosky heads the Infrastructure and Public-Private Partnership practice at 32 Advisors. He holds a DPhil in Law from Oxford University.

Michael has served as an Expert to OECD, US Treasury (internal), Governors, United Nations, Mayors, US Senators, and Members of the House of Representatives. He was Co-Chair of the Governor Edmund Brown Jr. Task Force to Modernize the California State Infrastructure and Economic Development Bank.

Michael has advised private investors and large multinationals extensively including DE Shaw, Goldman Sachs, JP Morgan, ABC, CBS, ESPN, NBC, NewsCorp, and others. He has advised leading labor union pension funds including AFL-CIO, AFSCME, American Federation of Teachers, LiUNA, SEIU, and United Food and Commercial Works.

Michael has written the five leading books on infrastructure investment, including three with Cambridge University Press. His books and work is widely credited as helping to drive the movement within the US toward public-private partnerships.

Michael has received financial awards from the Arts and Humanities Research Council, Ford Foundation, John and Mary R. Markle Foundation, Rockefeller Foundation, and Surdna Foundation.

Michael held the Professorship in International Economic Law (tenured) at the University of London and founded and ran New York University's Center for Law and Public Finance.

His views on the direction of the infrastructure market are widely sought. He appears regularly and publishes within the New York Times, Wall Street Journal, CNN, Associated Press, McKinsey Matters, Reuters, Bloomberg, Bond Buyer, Politico, Crain's, USA Today, and elsewhere.

Michael regularly delivers keynotes and featured talks to many of the leading industry conferences such as the US Chamber of Commerce, International Project Finance Association, Association for the Improvement of American Infrastructure, IJ Global, 3PC, and elsewhere.

Michael convenes the Reinvesting in America Series, the longest running forum devoted to infrastructure investment into the United States. It brings together investors and public officials for small off-the-record discussions with participation from US Defense, Transportation, Commerce, Congress, States, and others. The series also includes large events alternating between New York and Washington DC. The series is frequently sponsored by groups such as leading law firms, OECD, Partnership for New York City, Citizens Budget Commission, and Regional Plan Association.
